A – POSITION DESCRIPTION

1. Scope of Position

The Instructor Lifeguard is jointly responsible with the entire aquatic staff for the operation of programs in the aquatic facilities in the Township of North Huron. The main facility is currently the swimming pool at the North Huron Westcast Community Complex.

The Recreation Facilities Operation Manager is responsible for the physical resources of the North Huron Westcast Community Complex, including all program areas.

The Instructor Lifeguard reports directly to the Head Instructor Lifeguards, Senior Instructor Lifeguards and Aquatic Coordinator.

2. Key Responsibilities

- (a) Ensures money is properly handled
- (b) During Instructional Shifts:
 - Prepare core and daily lesson plans for each level assigned
 - Complete mid-session reports and progress cards which will be reviewed by the Head Instructor Lifeguards prior to the last lesson
 - Ensure classes begin/finish on time
 - Maintain program standards by reviewing skill of all swimmers
 - Assist with uncooperative children
 - Supervises Assistant Instructor Lifeguards
 - In charge of deck set up and clean up prior to and following lessons

- Ensure detailed lesson plans are left for replacement staff
- Maximize time in the water, minimize deck instruction time
- Worksheets and unclaimed report cards will be submitted to the Head Guard at the completion of the session
- Respond to major and minor incidents that could occur during lessons and document accordingly
- Respond to First Aid incidents and document accordingly

(c) During guarding shifts:

- Responds to major and minor incidents during recreational swims with proper documentation
- Enforce pool rules to maintain a safe and enjoyable pool environment
- Promote positive public relations and public image of the facility
- Respond to inquiries and concerns from the public and pass information onto the Aquatic Coordinator

(d) Other:

- Assist with special events at the pool
- Instruct Aquafit classes several times per week
- Monitor cleanliness of pool and staff areas
- Attend and take an active role in staff trainings and/or meetings as scheduled
- Keep qualifications up to date and pursue further training
- Act as a role model and endeavour to work as a team member with co-workers: set an example for other staff
- Perform all other duties as assigned by the Head Instructor Lifeguard, Senior Instructor Lifeguard and Aquatic Coordinator

Strong interpersonal, technical, and communication skills are essential to perform this position competently.

4. Decision Making Authority and Judgement Used

The Instructor Lifeguard is encouraged to make recommendations to Aquatic Coordinator for improving the efficiency and effectiveness of their duties.

Judgement is required:

- To deal with members of the public
 - To fulfill duties with care and recognition of safety issues
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5. Problem Solving Responsibility

Normally the problems to be solved are predictable and require no research beyond established policies and procedures.

B – POSITION SPECIFICATIONS

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C – POSITION CHARACTERISTICS

1. Impact & Accountabilities

The Instructor Lifeguard is responsible for Aquatic programs under their direction within their scheduled shifts.

A person performing this position competently can promote a professional image for the recreation department.

2. Supervisory Responsibility

Directly supervises the clientele of the Aquatic Centre and indirectly the Assistant Instructor Lifeguards.

D – WORKING CONDITIONS

1. Physical Effort and Environment

Instructor Lifeguards will work a variety of hours including early mornings, evenings and weekends.

Instructor Lifeguards must always be physically ready to respond to emergency situations.

Instructor Lifeguards teach Aquafit one or more times per week in extremely warm conditions in the aquatic environment.

2. Mental Effort

During lessons, aquafit classes and all recreational swims 100% mental attention and concentration is required to prevent and respond to emergencies.
